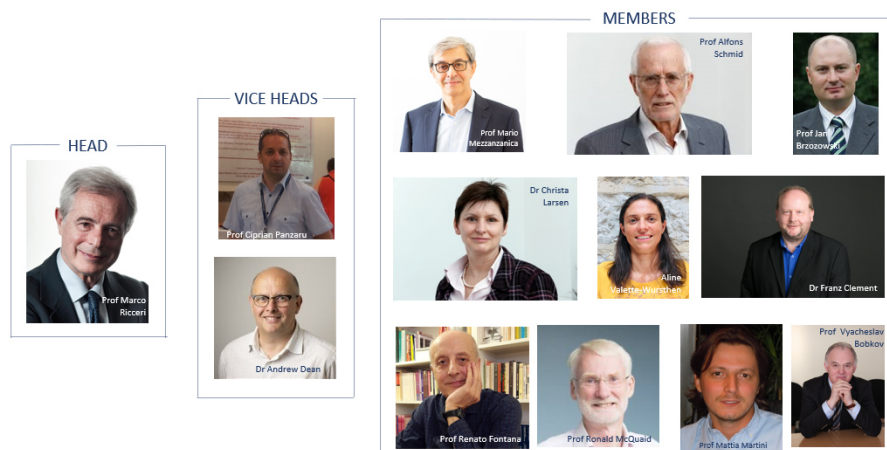

NEW ONLINE SEMINAR

“EU Labour Strategy and the new role of PES. Experiences from the Dutch PES. A Dutch project: a New Method to Create Labour Market Information for Students”

A seminar promoted by EURISPES Institute (Italy) and the European Network ENRLMM (Germany). Report by MICHEL VAN SMOORENBURG (UWV, The Netherlands).



Comments by international experts and open discussion. Basic documentation will be delivered in advance to the participants

The Dutch Project. The aim of the project is to achieve a more transparent picture of the (economic) consequences of study choices by means of better information. This may facilitate the transition from school to work for graduates. It also may prevent unemployment and decrease the pushing out of low-skilled workers in favour of the highly skilled. In brief, it may contribute to a more adequate adjustment of the education system to the needs of the labour market. The goal of the online seminar is to discuss the methods used in the Dutch project, to discuss advantages and disadvantages, as well as to share best practices and insights. The Dutch PES (UWV) collaborates in this project with the SEO research institute, which is affiliated with the University of Amsterdam. In order to analyse the labour market position of graduates ('graduate tracking'), SEO draws anonymised administrative data from the microdata of the Central Bureau of Statistics in the Netherlands.

UPDATE: ANTHOLOGY 2022

Our 2022 Anthology on the **"The Relevance of Artificial Intelligence in the Digital and Green Transformation of Regional and Local Labour Markets across Europe: Perspectives on Employment, Training, Placement and Social Inclusion"** is in the works!

It will encompass about 18 articles by authors from nine countries across Europe and beyond. We are more than excited to see the 2022 Anthology on the way and strongly believe it will pose a valuable contribution to research on AI and the labour market. The topics range from applied (national) case-studies to broader theory and frameworks on AI and the various challenges that come with its application. Therefore, we expect the 2022 Anthology to be of vital interest to stakeholders in politics, labour market observation or research, academia, as well as regulators.
