LABOUR SHORTAGE AND SURPLUS IN EUROPE

The European Labour Authority (ELA) annually publishes a report on Labour Shortages and Surpluses in Europe. The latest release of this report on labour market imbalances paints a vivid picture of a tightening labour landscape across Europe. This phenomenon is particularly pronounced in sectors such as construction, engineering, healthcare, and ICT.

The report itself has evolved notably, especially within the past two years. Data derive from the EURES National Coordination Offices, often in co-operation with the national Public Employment Services. The 29 participating countries provide lists of shortage and surpluses occupation at ISCO 4 digit level, and these data are linked and analysed by ELA.

The 6th of June 2024 a webinar was organised in which the main results have been presented by Irene Mandl of ELA. Her colleague Robert Komaromi demonstrated the new developed accompanying dashboard, where you can select the shortage and surplus occupations of interest and compare them between countries to see possible cross border matches. Our ENRLMM-member Michel van Smoorenburg also had a contribution, in which he dived into the role of the Public Employment Service in the Netherlands (UWV) in this report. His additional analyses showed that for 64% of the 194 Dutch shortage occupations there is at least one other European country which reports a surplus. This clarifies opportunities for employers to recruit abroad and it also could improve the process of issuing work permits to third country nationals.
